7. Growing nutritious foods (Vegetable gardening)

The picturesbelow show a school garden for training children in vegetable gardening and also vegetable production. The foods grown is used to feed school children. We grow Bugga, egg plants, Nakati, Carrots, Onions, Tomatoes, Akra and Cabbage.





8. Animals being reared

The pictures below show a small project of piggery rearing being run by the school for both training them in pig rearing and income generation. We have 8 pigs but would like to expand the project to 20 pigs if we get resources.



Qn. No. 9. Hut for raising chicken

We need to rear chickens to produce eggs for feeding the children and also have a surplus to sell to generate school revenue. There is a small area of school land where the hut for rearing chicken can be constructed.

Qn. No. 10. Need to plant corn

We need to plant maize and beans which is the major food stuff for feeding the children, in addition to providing maize bran for the pigs. Though the school does not have enough land but we can rent from those people with big land and grow the crops.

The photos below show the plight of the sanitation after the damage caused by earthquake to the school latrine and the underground water tank. The latrine is cracked and the water is leaking after serious cracks in it.
